The National Center for the Study of Collective Bargaining in Higher Education and the Professions (National Center) is an interdisciplinary labor-management research center at Hunter College, City University of New York (CUNY). Our research and programming focus on unionization, collective bargaining, labor relations, and labor history.

The National Center was established on August 1, 1972, pursuant to a resolution of the New York City Board of Higher Education. The concept and framework for the National Center was first proposed by Professor Donald Wollett at a 1970 national conference on collective negotiations in higher education organized by CUNY.¹

Since its creation, the National Center has functioned as a clearinghouse and forum for those who study and are engaged in collective bargaining and labor relations. It is composed of labor and management professionals, practitioners, and scholars who study contemporary and historical labor-management issues, best practices in collective bargaining, legal and legislative developments, and public support for higher education. The National Center's Board of Advisors includes administrators, union representatives, scholars, and attorneys from colleges and universities.

Throughout its history, the National Center has organized and sponsored national and regional conferences, workshops, and trainings on the substance and procedures of collective bargaining, labor relations, and related topics in higher education and the professions. National Center researchers publish monographs, academic research articles, and book chapters, and present research at professional conferences. In addition, the National Center publishes the peer-reviewed *Journal of Collective Bargaining in the Academy*, in conjunction with Eastern Illinois University.

A cornerstone of the National Center's research agenda is the collection and reporting on data about unionization, collective bargaining relationships, bargaining agents, and contracts in higher education. The data and analyses have been published by the National Center in periodic directories since the 1970s. In 2020, a supplemental directory was published that included data and hyperlinks to contracts for new collective bargaining relationships created between 2013 and 2019. Hyperlinks to prior National Center directories dating back to 1976 are available on our <u>website</u>.

Since 1973, the National Center has published a newsletter that also provides data and analysis regarding unionization and collective bargaining relationships in higher education. For the past decade, the National Center's <u>monthly electronic</u> <u>newsletter</u> has reported on representation petition filings, agency and court decisions, representation outcomes, and other developments relating to unionization and collective bargaining.

To help ensure that the National Center will be able to continue to offer research publications and future programming, we strongly encourage contributions from institutions, unions, law firms, scholars, and journals that access and use this 2024 Directory.

Introduction to the 2024 Directory

The 2024 Directory of Bargaining Agents and Contracts in Institutions of Higher Education (2024 Directory) is a continuation of a central National Center research function: collecting and reporting on data about collective bargaining relationships and contracts in higher education. For five decades, National Center directories have aggregated and analyzed data about collective bargaining units and agents in higher education, with a primary focus on union representation of faculty.

The 2024 Directory builds on and expands the scope of data presented in prior directories. It contains the results of over two years of data collection using electronic and hard copy survey instruments, followed by repeated emails and telephone calls from research team members to institutions and union representatives that were supplemented by data from other reliable sources.

The directory includes data for 902 collective bargaining units in higher education through January 1, 2024 involving tenured and tenure eligible faculty, non-tenure track faculty, department chairs, administrators, postdoctoral scholars, and academic researchers and graduate and undergraduate student employees at public and private non-profit institutions.

A significant feature of the 2024 Directory are hyperlinks to 813 electronic versions of recent contracts for collective bargaining relationships identified in the directory.² This covers 90% of the bargaining relationships identified in the directory. The unavailability of some contracts reflects the refusal of certain parties to provide contracts, or the lack of a first contract for newer certified or recognized bargaining units.

The 2024 Directory is the first publicly available comprehensive collection of collective bargaining agreements in higher education. The contracts transcend institutional types and sectors, geography, and the national union affiliations of bargaining agents.

To assist with and expedite publication of future directories, the National Center has included in the 2024 Directory an <u>update portal</u> for parties to submit current first or successor contracts along with proposed edits and updates to data in the tables. We strongly encourage parties to utilize this tool to assist in making updated data and contracts available to the higher education community and other researchers.

The inclusion of bargaining unit data with hyperlinks to contracts is a continuation of our approach in the 2020 Supplementary Directory of New Bargaining Agents and Contracts in Institutions of Higher Education, 2013-2019 (2020 Supplementary Directory).³ The 2020 Supplementary Directory presented and analyzed data about new bargaining units involving faculty, department chairs, administrators, postdoctoral scholars, and graduate student employees in the seven-year period prior to the COVID-19 pandemic along with hyperlinks to applicable contracts. The data utilized in the 2020 Supplementary Directory came from documentary sources. The research methodology for that directory was responsive to the documented difficulties in receiving survey responses from institutions and unions for the 2006 and 2012 Directories.⁴

Following publication of the 2020 Supplementary Directory, the National Center decided to return to the use of a survey instrument. In 2021, the National Center launched an electronic survey, which was sent to hundreds of administrators, labor and state union affiliate contacts, and distributed by other electronic means. Later that year, the National Center assembled a research team which began to directly contact institutions and labor representatives by telephone and email.

Throughout the research, the National Center continued to collect data on newly certified or recognized bargaining units of faculty, postdoctoral scholars, and graduate and undergraduate student employees. The data was collected from documentary sources such as certifications issued by the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) and similar state labor relations agencies and were reported in the National Center's monthly electronic newsletter.⁵

In September 2023, the National Center published a study analyzing the data relating to unionization and strike data in higher education for the period of January 1, 2022-June 30, 2023.⁶ At present, research team members are working on a National Center publication that will include anti-discrimination provisions taken from various contracts that are linked in this directory.

Glossary of Terms and Symbols

The following is a glossary of terms and symbols used in the 2024 Directory:

Bargaining Agent: A bargaining agent is a union certified by a government agency or recognized by an institution of higher education as the exclusive representative of all employees in a bargaining unit for purposes of collective bargaining.

Bargaining Agent Affiliation: Bargaining agents are frequently affiliated with national and state unions, while others are independent. Some national unions have state affiliates, while others have locals or councils. Table A1 is a list of national and state affiliations, along with acronyms, for the bargaining agents identified in the tables, charts, and figures.

Bargaining Unit: A group of workers represented for purposes of collective bargaining with an institution of higher education. Bargaining unit composition is determined by the NLRB, a public sector labor relations agency, or through an agreement between a union and an employer.

Bargaining Unit Composition: Bargaining unit composition in higher education can vary widely from institution to institution and is subject to modification. Faculty can be in a single bargaining unit or divided into separate bargaining units at the same institution. Faculty can also be part of a combined unit with other job titles including chairs, postdoctoral scholars, librarians, and/or graduate student employees. In the same manner, non-instructional titles can be represented in combined units with faculty or in separate bargaining units. Table A2 includes separate bargaining units of faculty and combined units of faculty, department chairs, graduate student employees, and other professional job titles.

To help avoid confusion, we have used abbreviated categories and symbols to describe and identify unit compositions in the directory:

 Faculty: Employees whose duties include academic instruction, academic research, and/or service, or other duties in support of an institution's educational mission. Some units may include librarians with faculty status or non-faculty professional titles.

- Full-Time Tenured and Tenure Track (FT TTT): Faculty employed on a fulltime basis who have tenure or are tenure eligible.
- Full-Time Non-Tenured or Non-Tenure Track (FT NTT): Faculty employed on a full-time basis who do not have tenure or the prospect of tenure.
- Part-Time Tenured and Tenure Track (PT TTT): Faculty employed on a parttime basis who have tenure or the prospect of tenure.
- Part-Time Non-Tenured or Non-Tenure Track (PT NTT): Faculty employed on a part-time basis who do not have tenure or the prospect of tenure.
- **Librarian:** Academic librarians and archivists with faculty status, with or without tenure or the prospect of tenure.
- **Department Chairs (CHR):** Faculty in an academic department with supervisory responsibilities over departmental operations, faculty, and support staff. Bargaining units composed solely of department chairs are included in Table A2.
- Administrators: Bargaining units with administrator titles that might have academic instructional and research responsibilities and/or are directly involved in instruction or research design. Table A3 identifies separate bargaining units with administrators.
- Postdoctoral Scholars and Academic Researchers: Scholars and researchers with non-tenure track titles such as postdoctoral fellows, postdoctoral research scientists, postdoctoral research scholars, or academic researchers in a separate unit or a combined one with faculty. Table A4 identifies separate bargaining units of postdoctoral scholars and academic researchers.
- Graduate Student Employees (GSE): Graduate student employees with academic titles such as teaching assistants, research assistants, and graduate assistants or who

perform non-academic work for an institution. Table A5 identifies separate units of graduate student employees and combined units with undergraduate student employees.

Undergraduate Student Employees
 (USE): Undergraduate student employees
 performing academic duties or those working
 in dormitories, dining halls, or performing
 non-academic work in other campus work
 locations. Table A6 identifies undergradu ate-only student employee bargaining units.

Bargaining Unit Size: The total number of employees in a bargaining unit as distinct from the number of employees who are union members. Bargaining unit sizes are approximate and can change from year to year and semester by semester, particularly for non-tenure track faculty and student employee bargaining units.

Certification or Recognition: A union can be certified by the NLRB following a representation election or certified by a state labor relations agency following an election or a card check. An institution of higher education can also voluntarily recognize a bargaining agent following an election or a card check conducted by a neutral third party.

Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA): A contract between an institution of higher education and a union on behalf of a bargaining unit for a specific period. Contracts can be extended or modified through negotiated memoranda of agreements between the parties. Hyperlinks to available recent contracts for collective bargaining units identified in the directory are included in Tables A2-A6.

Current Agent Recognized: The year in which the current bargaining agent was elected or otherwise recognized as the representative of the bargaining unit.

Current CBA Expires: The month and year the recent collective bargaining agreement expires.

Initial Agent Recognized: The year the first bargaining agent was certified by an administrative agency or recognized by the employer as the exclusive representative of a bargaining unit. This may differ from the year that the current agent was elected because the bargaining agent could have changed since the initial agent was certified or recognized. In Tables A2-A6, initial agent recognition dates are provided if the initial agent was certified or recognized in a different year from the current agent.

Initial CBA Ratified: The year the bargaining unit and/or the institution first ratified a collective bargaining agreement.

Institution: The name of the employing college, university, or system with a certified or recognized collective bargaining agent representing a unit of faculty, department chairs, administrators, non-instructional professionals, postdoctoral scholars, graduate, and undergraduate student employees.

Union: An alternative term for the certified or recognized bargaining agent that represents a defined collective bargaining unit. It can have a national and/or state affiliation or be independent.

Scope of the Data

The 2024 Directory data details collective bargaining relationships involving tenured, tenure eligible, and non-tenure track faculty, department chairs and administrators, postdoctoral scholars, and academic researchers and graduate and undergraduate student employees in higher education. The unit of observation is an individual collective bargaining unit. This study includes all academic bargaining units and separate non-academic student employee bargaining units at public and non-profit private Title IV degree-granting institutions of higher education in existence at the start of calendar year 2024.⁷

The directory includes data for 902 collective bargaining units in higher education including 775 faculty and chair-only bargaining units, 19 administrator units,⁸ 10 exclusively postdoctoral scholar units, two exclusively academic researcher units, 81 GSE units, and 19 exclusively USE units.⁹

For each collective bargaining unit in Tables A2-A6 we present the following data: bargaining agent name and affiliations, including any applicable national and state affiliation or local or council number, the composition of the unit, the size of the unit, the institution that employs the unit members, the state in which it is located, whether the employing institution is a two-year or four-year institution, the year that the current agent for the unit was recognized, the year the initial collective bargaining agreement for the unit was ratified, the year that the current collective bargaining agreement expires, and a link to the most recent collective bargaining agreement.

Bargaining unit composition varies from institution to institution. The composition of bargaining units can differ based on faculty status (TTT or NTT or FT or PT). Faculty units can include other professional titles such as department chairs, postdoctoral scholars, librarians, coaches, or graduate student employees. Bargaining units at universities may or may not include faculty working at professional schools. At some institutions, non-faculty professional titles may be in separate bargaining units. Student employee bargaining units can include graduate student employees only, undergraduate student employees only, or a combination of both.

The wide variations in unit composition reflect different legal standards applicable under federal and state collective bargaining laws as well as the preferences of unions, institutions, and the employees. Due to the challenges faced in collecting and managing a dataset this large and complex, the 2024 Directory does not delineate all the other professional titles that might be included in a combined unit of faculty and other employees. In many instances, the most direct information concerning a specific unit composition can be found in a contract's recognition clause or the certification issued by the NLRB or a similar public sector labor agency.

The size of a bargaining unit presented in the dataset reflects the total number of employees in that unit. Unit size should not be confused with union membership size, which in the post-*Janus* era might be smaller.¹⁰ In reporting on the size of combined bargaining units, we were unable to

disaggregate the number of employees by title due to incomplete survey data.¹¹

For each unit, we provide the name of the employing college or university. This is not necessarily the same name of the employer listed in the contract, particularly in states with community college districts. For example, the dataset references John A. Logan College instead of the Board of Trustees of Community College District No. 530, Counties of Williamson, Jackson, Franklin, Randolph and Perry. This approach is consistent with the methodologies of prior National Center Directories and the National Center for Education Statistics' Integrated Postsecondary Data System (IPEDS).¹²

We include the year the current agent representing the unit was recognized,¹³ as well as the year their first contract was ratified.¹⁴ Finally, we collected the month and year that the most recent available collective bargaining agreement expires. In Tables A2-A6, we provide hyperlinks to contracts for 813 collective bargaining units.

Prior directories have listed the campuses subject to a collective bargaining relationship. We have chosen not to do so in the 2024 Directory given the ambiguity surrounding how IPEDS and institutions themselves define what constitutes a campus. If a bargaining unit includes represented employees on only a single campus in a university system, we made this fact clear in the name of the institution. For example, if a union represents academic workers on the University of Massachusetts-Amherst campus only, we list the name of the campus rather than the University of Massachusetts system.

Table A1 is a listing of national and state affiliates of collective bargaining agents in higher education along with acronyms used in the 2024 dataset.

Table A2 presents data for all faculty bargaining units at private non-profit and public higher education institutions that include FT TTT, PT TTT, FT NTT, PT NTT, and/or department chairs. We utilize ^ to identify which units are at private sector non-profit institutions, ‡ for units with other professional titles, and * for units where the bargaining unit size was derived from sources other than survey responses.

Table A3 includes data for separate bargaining units of administrators in higher education.

Table A4 lists and presents data for all separate postdoctoral scholar collective bargaining units, and two new academic researcher units. It does not include data about combined units with postdoctoral scholars, faculty, and/or other professional titles.

Table A5 presents data for all GSE collective bargaining units in higher education including some that include USEs.

Table A6 presents data for all academic and non-academic USE bargaining units in higher education. It does not include data about units with USEs and other academic or non-academic titles.

Research Methodology

The following is a description of the research methodology used for the 2024 Directory.

I. Academic Bargaining Unit Survey

The National Center conducted an academic collective bargaining survey using Qualtrics, which was distributed to a list of 520 higher education administrator contacts, 608 union contacts, 42 state union affiliate contacts, and 37 graduate student employee union contacts. Additionally, the survey was distributed monthly to close to 4,000 contacts nationwide through the National Center's electronic newsletter and via social media.

The list of contacts utilized was constructed by combining and updating contact information in our database for institutions and unions listed in the 2020 Supplemental Directory and 2012 Directory. From this list, the National Center built an index of contact information for each union and institution. The survey was open, and data was collected from July 7, 2021, until December 31, 2023.

The initial survey asked respondents to provide information about a variety of details associated with their collective bargaining units. We chose to limit the number of required inquiries in the hope of enhancing the response rate. The survey mandated completion of certain core information: the institution's name and state; the bargaining agent's name and its national affiliate; bargaining unit composition; bargaining unit size; number of campuses covered by the contract; and an electronic copy of the current contract.

Additional survey questions sought voluntary responses such as a breakdown of the number FT TTT faculty, PT TTT faculty, FT NTT faculty, and PT NTT faculty in each bargaining unit as well as the number and titles of non-faculty in the unit; bargaining agent's state affiliate; the month and year the bargaining agent was certified or recognized; the year the first contract was ratified or approved; the month the current contract would expire; and information concerning negotiated labor-management agreements relating to issues stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic.

Due to the meager initial electronic survey response rate (13.7%), a research team was assembled, made up of CUNY faculty, doctoral and graduate students, Hunter College undergraduates and staff to directly contact administrators and labor representatives by telephone and email. Research team members were assigned spreadsheets by state with contact information for administrators and labor representatives for each collective bargaining unit missing a survey response. Multiple calls and emails were often necessary to receive relevant data for a specific bargaining unit. When necessary, a Word document version of the survey was distributed, and research team members also accepted abbreviated survey responses over the telephone.

Team members also reached out to higher education organizations, national administrator and attorney organizations, and national, state, and local union representatives for assistance in obtaining survey responses. Certain institutions and unions refused to provide requested data or copies of their contracts.

Due to the challenges faced in collecting the data, the research team turned to alternative data sources discussed below.

In the end, the overall survey response rate was 95.5% for all higher education collective bargaining relationships. Union representatives were responsible for 63% of the responses and administrators for 37%. By far the fewest questions answered by union representatives and administrators were with respect to pandemic related agreements.

II. Supplemental Data Sources

When a response did not include the current unit size, we relied on the 2020 Supplemental Directory, the 2012 Directory, available data from the NLRB or analogous state labor agencies, other public filings, and publicly available data provided by higher education institutions¹⁵ In rare situations, IPEDS was used to derive a unit's size when we were unable to gather this information by other means.

Most survey responses did not include the date of recognition or the date of ratification of the first contract. For that missing information we relied on data from the 2020 Supplemental Directory and the 2012 Directory, certifications issued by the NLRB and state labor agencies, recognition agreements, union websites or other public filings.¹⁶ Missing contracts or the most recent agreements were obtained by downloading them from institutional or union websites or through responses to National Center freedom of information requests.

Where available, we used collective bargaining agreements to determine or confirm a unit's bargaining agent name and state affiliation.

IPEDS data was used to derive whether a university or college was a four-year or two-year institution and whether it was a public or a private non-profit institution.

III. Cleaning and Coding the Data

Following completion of the data collection, the research team cleaned and coded the data, and took steps to ensure that the linked contracts were accessible.

Research team members double-checked survey responses concerning institution name, bargaining agent name, affiliations, and unit composition against the terms of the collective bargaining agreements received. In cases where conflicting or ambiguous information was received concerning unit size, we averaged conflicting submissions or adopted the midpoint of a range given by different respondents.

Summary of 2024 Findings

In this section, we summarize our findings concerning the current scope of collective bargaining representation in higher education.¹⁷ The findings are divided into five sections that analyze union representation¹⁸ patterns among faculty, administrators, postdoctoral scholars and academic researchers, graduate student and undergraduate student employees respectively.

I. Faculty Representation in Higher Education




Figure 1. Union-Represented and Non-Represented Faculty

By the beginning of 2024, faculty union representation in the United States was 27%, with a total of 402,217¹⁹ unionized faculty (see Figure 1) at over 600 institutions across 30 states and the District of Columbia.²⁰ Nationwide, there are currently 775 faculty bargaining units at public sector and private sector institutions of higher education.²¹

Key Findings

The rate of faculty union representation stands at 27%, as of January 1, 2024, with a total of 402,217 unionized faculty.

- CA, NY, and NJ have the highest number of unionized faculty.
- The total number of unionized faculty grew by 7.5% since 2012.
- Represented faculty in the private sector grew by 56%, relative to a 4% growth in the public sector, since 2012.

Representation of non-faculty titles grew substantially since 2012.

- In January 2024, there were 10 bargaining units of exclusively postdoctoral scholars with a total of 11,471 employees and two academic research units with a total of 6,132 employees.
- GSE union representation was 38% in January 2024with over 150,000 employees in 81 units. GSE representation increased by 133% since 2012 with 60% of the growth of in the private sector.
- There were 19 exclusively USE units with 3,515 represented employees at the beginning of January 2024.

A. Faculty Representation by State

Figure 2 presents the scope of faculty union representation by state. As of January 1, 2024, the states with the largest number of unionized faculty are California (93,705), New York (87,848), New Jersey (25,549), Florida (23,812),²² and Illinois (20,944). The five states with the fewest unionized faculty are North Carolina (327), Nevada (722), Montana (1,546), Delaware (1,565), and Alaska (1,736).


There are faculty bargaining units at public institutions across 29 states and the District of Columbia whereas faculty bargaining units at private institutions are found in 19 states along with the District of Columbia.²³

States with the highest percentage of represented faculty are Hawaii (76.3%), Maine (73.6%), New Jersey (73.5%), Alaska (70.1%), and New York (70.0%). In those same five states, the union representation rate of faculty is substantially higher than the overall representation rate of workers. Two of the states, Hawaii and New York, also possess the highest state-level rates of union membership in 2024.²⁴




Figure 3 is a map of the United States displaying the number of faculty units by individual state. Darker colored states have a greater number of faculty units. A majority of states have at least one faculty collective bargaining unit, with California (120), Illinois (93), New York (92), and Michigan (56) all having greater than 50 units. The geographic distribution of faculty bargaining units today is similar to the distribution of newly unionized units doumented in the 2020 Supplemental Directory.²⁶ Like the rates of faculty union representation, faculty bargaining units tend to be most heavily concentrated in coastal states and throughout the upper Midwest. Florida stands out among Southern states in the number of faculty bargaining units, which is comparable to states such as Oregon and Pennsylvania.²⁷




Figure 4. Faculty Union Representation by Institution Type

B. Faculty Representation by Institution Type and Unit Composition

By the beginning of 2024, there were a total number of 361,759 unionized faculty at public colleges and universities and 40,458 at private non-profit institutions.

Figure 4 breaks down the number of union-represented faculty by sector and level. Union representation at public two-year institutions remains the highest at 52%, followed by 4-year public institutions at 33%, and four-year private non-profit institutions at 8%. The distribution of faculty representation, with the highest concentrations among public institutions, is attributable to the continuing impact of the Supreme Court's 1980 *NLRB v. Yeshiva University* decision,²⁸ which limited the right of faculty to unionize and engage in collective bargaining under the National Labor Relations Act (NLRA). Figure 4 does not include data on two-year private non-profit institutions as there are very few of these types of institutions in higher education.²⁹

Tables 1 and 2 display the distribution of faculty units by unit composition and institution type. Table 1 demonstrates that two-thirds of all faculty units at private four-year institutions are exclusively NTT units and over 90% of faculty units in the private sector contain NTT faculty.

The breakdown of faculty unit composition at public sector institutions is significantly different from the private sector. One third of faculty bargaining units at public two-year institutions and just over a quarter of units at public four-year institutions are exclusively NTT.³⁰ This finding reflects the distinct legal standards for bargaining unit composition between state collective bargaining laws and the NLRA.³¹

Moreover, Table 2 shows that a higher proportion of PT faculty units are in the private sector (41.8%) relative to the public sector. The higher concentration of PT faculty in private non-profit institutions is attributable to the fact that the vast majority of these positions are NTT, and that the NTT faculty are not generally subject to exclusion from representation under the *Yeshiva* doctrine because, typically, they are not part of shared governance.

At private four-year colleges and universities, 68% of the units include PT faculty compared to only 51% at public two-year institutions and 58% at public four-year institutions. The percentage of part-time only units is twice as high at private four-year schools (42%) compared to public two-year schools (20%), and three times higher than at public four-year schools (13%). Almost half of faculty units at public two-year schools are full-time only units.³³

C. Law School and Medical School Faculty Representation

A subject frequently overlooked in the scholarship is the scope of faculty representation at law schools and medical schools. While the 2012 Directory identified only one standalone law school faculty bargaining unit, the 2024 Directory includes data for six distinct law school faculty units, four at public sector institutions and two in the private sector with a combined total of 219 represented law faculty. Distinct faculty bargaining units exist at the following law schools: Temple University-Beasley School of Law, University of New Hampshire-Franklin Pierce School of Law, Cleveland State University-Cleveland-Marshall School of Law, University of Toledo College of Law, University of San Francisco School of Law, and Fordham University Law School.³⁵

In addition, the 2024 Directory includes university-wide bargaining units with represented law school faculty at institutions such as the CUNY School of Law, University of Buffalo School of Law, Rutgers Law School, the University of Cincinnati College of Law, Wayne State University Law School, the William S. Richardson School of Law at the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa, and the University of Pittsburgh School of Law. The combined total number of represented law faculty at those university-wide bargaining units is approximately 947.³⁶

The 2024 Directory also includes data about union represented faculty at certain medical schools in university-wide or standalone bargaining units at the CUNY School of Medicine, SUNY Downstate Health Sciences University, SUNY Upstate Medical University, the University of Buffalo Jacobs School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences, the University of Connecticut Health Center, Wayne State University School of Medicine, Rutgers New Jersey Medical School, Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, and Cooper Medical School of Rowan University.³⁷

D. Faculty Representation by National Affiliation

Historically, a majority of organized faculty have been represented by three national unions: the American Federation of Teachers (AFT), the National Education Association (NEA), and American Association of University Professors (AAUP).³⁸ These organizations continue to represent the vast majority of unionized faculty. In June 2022, AAUP became an AFT affiliate and in certain states there are joint AFT/NEA state affiliations. The three national organizations, separately and jointly, cover 83% of the represented faculty and are national affiliates for 80% of all faculty units.³⁹ Over the past decade, however, SEIU substantially expanded its faculty representational role, particularly among NTT faculty, and represented, as of January 1, 2024, 61 faculty bargaining units at private non-profit institutions and at 23 public institutions.

Table 3 displays the number of union-represented faculty by national affiliate and institution type and Table 4 displays the number of faculty units by national affiliate and institution type.

E. Department Chairs

A perennial issue in higher education collective bargaining is whether department chairs are entitled to unionize, and if so, whether they should be included in a faculty bargaining unit, in a separate bargaining unit, or in a combined unit with non-instructional faculty or administrators.⁴²

Often these issues are determined by the applicable collective bargaining law and the specific duties and responsibilities of the department chairs at a particular institution. Under the NLRA, department chairs at private non-profit institutions are excluded from coverage because they are managers and supervisors. While department chairs are more commonly afforded collective bargaining rights in the public sector, in select cases chairs have been excluded from the right to union representation. For example, in 2015 department chairs in a long-existing faculty bargaining unit at Temple University were ordered excluded from the unit on the grounds that their job duties were now managerial.⁴³

Table A2 includes six separate department chair units and one program director unit,⁴⁴ including three chair units at four-year institutions that were




Figure 5. Faculty Union Representation, 2024 Directory Data vs. 2012 Directory Data

certified since 2012. In comparison, the 2012 Directory identified only four department chair bargaining units, each at a community college.

F. Growth in Represented Faculty since the 2012 Directory

Figure 5 displays the growth in the number of union-represented faculty and the faculty unionization rate between the 2012 Directory and the 2024 Directory. We find that the total number of unionized faculty grew by 7.5% as compared to the findings in the 2012 Directory. Nevertheless, during the same period the number of faculty employed nationwide also grew by 2.3%, resulting in a net 4.5% increase in the rate of faculty unionization overall.

The significance of the growth rate in represented faculty in higher education since the 2012 Directory is underscored by comparing it with the nationwide decline in the percentage of union representation between 2012 and 2023. The United States Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics found the nationwide rate of union representation was 12.5% in 2012 and 11.2% in 2023.⁴⁵




Figure 6. Historical Trend in Faculty Collective Bargaining Unit Growth, 1976-2024

The steady increase in faculty collective bargaining units between 2012 and 2024 is consistent with faculty collective bargaining growth since 1976. Figure 6 presents faculty unit growth data since 1976 taken from prior National Center Directories.⁴⁶ The long-term growth trend in faculty bargaining units over the past half-century has been highly linear with an average growth of 11.6 units per year. The number of units at the start of 2024, 775, is up from the 652 identified in the 2012 Directory, constituting a growth of 19%.

However, this historical trend in faculty unit growth obscures differences in the change of two distinct variables: institutional type and bargaining unit composition. Prior to 2012, faculty unionization grew at a much faster rate at community colleges and public four-year institutions than at private institutions, which saw periods of actual decline resulting from the *Yeshiva* decision. During that time, the trend in faculty bargaining unit composition moved from predominantly combined TTT and NTT bargaining units to separate units.⁴⁷ Since 2012, there has been a significant increase in the number of successful NTT unionization efforts, primarily at private institutions.

Table 5 compares the numbers of represented faculty from the 2024 Directory to the 2012 Directory by institutional sector (i.e. public vs. private control). The net change in the number of represented faculty in the public sector (+13,509) was very similar to that in the private sector (+14,529). However, given that the vast majority of unionized faculty are in the public sector, these similar net growth numbers equal only 3.9% growth in the public sector.

Table 6 further demonstrates that the growth in the private sector has been a major factor in faculty unionization growth over the past decade. In 2012, there were 84 private sector faculty bargaining units, comprising only 12.9% of all faculty bargaining units in higher education. Since that time, the majority of newly certified faculty bargaining units has been in the private sector, nearly doubling the total number of private sector units.

By the beginning of 2024, almost 20% of all faculty bargaining units were in the private sector. Much of that growth stems from an increased attention by SEIU to NTT faculty unionization, particularly at private non-profit institutions. As of January 1, 2024, it represented 83 faculty units with a total of 30,495 faculty (see Tables 3 and 4).





Figure 7. Newly Represented Faculty, 2013-2023⁴⁸

Figure 7 disaggregates the number of newly unionized faculty by year beginning in 2013, while Figure 8 presents the number of new certified or recognized faculty bargaining units by year over the same period.

In the years between 2014 and 2019, faculty union growth was substantial, averaging nearly 6,250 newly organized faculty per year. In 2020, with the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, growth in newly represented faculty fell substantially, followed by a return to high rate of annual growth towards the end of the pandemic in 2021, and smaller annual growth in 2022 and 2023. The trend in newly certified faculty bargaining units by year over the period largely tracks the pattern of growth in newly represented faculty per year. However, in the years 2018, 2019, and 2021, the certification of a smaller number of new units containing larger numbers of faculty led to outsized growth in those years.

48 Figures 7 and 8 include seven units that accreted new faculty or have since merged with other units: a FT TTT-NTT unit at Keene State College accreted new faculty in 2013; a PT NTT unit at Community College of Allegheny County accreted new faculty in 2015; a PT NTT unit at Temple University accreted new faculty in 2015; a PT NTT unit at Northeastern University merged with a larger PT NTT unit in 2016; a FT-PT NTT unit at Boston University merged with a larger PT NTT unit in 2016; a PT NTT unit at NYU Tandon School of Engineering certified merged with a larger PT NTT unit in 2017; a FT-PT TTT-NTT unit at Antioch University accreted new faculty in 2021.

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The overwhelming majority of new units between 2013 and 2023 contained NTT faculty (126 units, 83.4%) and nearly three-quarters of the new units were exclusively NTT units (108 units, 71.5%). The dataset does not permit disaggregation of the exact number of newly represented NTT faculty during the period, but exclusively NTT faculty bargaining units made up 72.2% of all newly represented faculty.

When examining differences between FT and PT faculty, the distribution of new units that represent FT faculty only, PT only, or both is more even across titles. The types of units certified most frequently since 2012 were those exclusively representing PT faculty (59 units, 39.1%), followed by those exclusively representing FT faculty (51 units, 33.8%), and then those that represent both FT and PT faculty (41 units, 27.2%).

II. Administrator Representation

Table A3 presents a list of 19 known bargaining units composed of administrators at public institutions who may be involved in instruction or research.⁴⁹ The units are broken down by institutional type and bargaining unit composition.

Three of the administrator units also contain department chairs. Fourteen of the 19 administrator bargaining units are at two-year institutions. Seven of the units have independent bargaining agents, five are affiliated with NEA, three are jointly affiliated with AFT/NEA, two are affiliated with AFT, one with AFT/AAUP, and one with AFSCME. Six of the administrator units are in New Jersey, five are in New York, two are in Michigan, and there is one administrator unit each in California, Connecticut, Florida, Maine, Nebraska, and Rhode Island.

III. Postdoctoral Scholar and Academic Researcher Representation

Unionization efforts among early career scientists in postdoctoral scholar positions began over a half-century ago, when they organized with interns and residents at the University of Michigan.⁵⁰ However, prior to the 2020 Supplemental Directory, National Center directories did not include specific data concerning representation of postdoctoral scholars and related academic researchers. This is due in part to these positions being included in combined bargaining units with faculty or other titles.

Over the past two decades there has been a steady growth in separate bargaining units of postdoctoral scholars, as the number of such academic positions have increased, particularly those funded by research grants.⁵¹ The first distinct postdoctoral scholar bargaining unit was recognized at the University of California in 2008, followed by Rutgers University in 2009, and the University of Massachusetts-Amherst in 2010.

At the beginning of 2024, there were 10 separate bargaining units of exclusively postdoctoral scholars, six at public universities and four at private institutions representing a total of 11,471 employees. A majority (7) of those units are represented by the UAW. The UAW also represents two academic researcher units at the University of

California and the University of Washington with a combined total of 6,132 represented employees.⁵²

Table 7 displays the number of represented postdoctoral scholars and academic researchers by national affiliate and institution type at 12 separate bargaining units. Table 8 displays the number of exclusively postdoctoral scholar and academic researcher units by national affiliate and institution type.

In addition to the postdoctoral scholar and academic researcher units listed in Table A4, there are at least nine faculty bargaining units with an unspecified number of postdoctoral scholars at the following institutions: University of Oregon, Oregon State University, Fordham University, Goucher College, New College of Florida, and three units at CUNY Research Foundation. For this reason, the totals displayed in Table 7 likely represent an undercount of the total number of unionized postdoctoral scholars and academic researchers as of January 1, 2024.




Figure 9. Union-Represented and Non-Represented Graduate Student Employees

IV. Graduate Student Employee Representation⁵³


By the beginning of 2024, there were approximately 150,104 union-represented graduate

student employees in 81 units in U.S. higher education. Figure 9 displays GSE representation in the United States. Nationwide, nearly 40% of graduate student employees were unionized.⁵⁴






A. GSE Representation by State

As of January 1, 2024, there were GSE bargaining units at institutions in 23 states along with the District of Columbia. The states with the highest number of union-represented graduate student employees are California (41,460), Massachusetts (18,732), New York (16,475), Illinois (12,511), and Florida (10,286). Figure 10 presents a map displaying the number of units by state. Darker colored states have a greater number of GSE units. The states with the highest number of GSE bargaining units are Massachusetts (15), New York (13), Illinois (10), California (6), and Oregon (5). Although California has the most represented GSEs by a wide margin, the state has only six distinct GSE units.





B. GSE Representation by Sector

Figure 11 displays the number of union-represented graduate student employees by sector at the start of 2024. The total number of GSEs represented at public sector institutions was nearly twice the number at private universities. While only one-third of the total number of represented GSEs work at private institutions, that figure demonstrates the substantial shift that took place in the landscape of GSE union representation over the past decade. In 2012, the only existing private sector bargaining units that included GSEs were at the SUNY Research Foundation and the CUNY Research Foundation.⁵⁵ In the beginning of 2024, the percentage of GSEs represented at private institutions (60.2%) was close to double the percentage of those represented at public institutions (32.5%). Almost half of all GSE collective bargaining units (45.7%) were at private institutions; this is due to private sector units tending to be smaller in size on average.

C. GSE Representation by National Affiliation

Tables 9 and 10 show the number of represented graduate student employees and GSE bargaining units by national union affiliation. They demonstrate that the UAW represents the largest number of GSE bargaining units (19) nationwide and almost one-half (42.6%) of all represented GSE at public and private institutions. UE represents the second largest number of graduate student employees nationwide, and the largest percentage (40.6%) at private institutions. AFT, separately and jointly with NEA or AAUP, represents 26 GSE units, primarily in the public sector, and 20.5% of the total number of GSE represented nationwide.



D. Growth in Represented GSEs since the 2012 Directory

As noted above, since 2012 there has been a dramatic increase in the number of represented GSEs in the United States. Figure 12 compares the total number of represented GSEs in the 2012 Directory with the total number represented at the beginning of 2024. It demonstrates that the total number of represented GSEs increased by a dramatic 133% in a little more than a decade.





Figure 13. Newly Represented Graduate Student Employees, 2013-2023

Figures 13 and 14 display the massive growth in newly represented graduate student employees and newly certified GSE units from 2013 to 2023. A substantial percentage of this growth occurred at private non-profit universities following the NLRB's 2016 *Columbia University* decision,⁵⁶ which concluded that graduate and undergraduate student workers were employees for purposes of the NLRA.

In the two years following *Columbia University*, there was an immediate increase in new GSE collective bargaining relationships. However, changes in the NLRB Board's majority, which resulted from the outcome in the 2016 presidential election, led unions to withdraw pending GSE

representation cases at the NLRB out of concern that the *Columbia University* decision would be reversed.⁵⁷ This legal concern, along with disruptions caused by the pandemic, explains in large part the meager GSE unionization growth between 2019 and 2020.

Subsequent changes to the NLRB Board majority, following the 2020 presidential election outcome, along with the end of the pandemic, led to a surge in successful GSE unionization at private institutions. Between 2021 and 2023, there were 63,680 newly organized GSEs, which was nearly triple the number of newly organized GSEs during the prior eight years combined (20,394).

Figure 14. Newly Certified Graduate Student Bargaining Units, 2013-2023







Figure 15. Union-represented Graduate Student Employees by Sector, 2012-2024

Figure 15 shows GSE representation growth disaggregated by sector. Over 50% more GSEs were newly organized in the private sector

(51,615) between 2013 and 2023, as compared to the public sector (34,065). $^{\rm 58}$

In 2012, there were 29 standalone GSE units in higher education.⁵⁹ Only one of those units had a private employer: the SUNY Research

Foundation. By the end of 2023, 37 of the 81 GSE bargaining units (45.7%) were at private non-profit institutions.

V. Undergraduate Student Employee Representation

At the beginning of 2024, there were 3,515 unionized employees in 19 exclusively USE bargaining units across nine states. Between January 2021 and December 31, 2023, unions were certified to represent 17 new separate USE units at 4-year private institutions and the Grinnell College bargaining unit expanded to a wall-to-wall USE unit.⁶⁰ One factor underlying the growth in USE unionization at private institutions is the NLRB's *Columbia University* decision, which concluded that academic and non-academic undergraduate student workers had the right to unionize under the NLRA.

Unionization efforts by undergraduate student workers have a long unwritten history. The earliest attempt might have been the 1914 formation of the Wisconsin Student Workers' Union at the University of Wisconsin.⁶¹ The student worker union was never recognized but it did lead to the first known USE work stoppage.⁶²

Since collective bargaining laws became applicable to higher education in the late 1960s, AFSCME was certified in 1970 to represent a unit of undergraduate student dining workers at the University of Oregon,⁶³ which led to the first known USE collective bargaining agreement.⁶⁴ In 1973 student workers at the State University of New York at Stony Brook were permitted to vote in a representation election involving a campus-wide bargaining unit with a private sector employer on campus.⁶⁵ There were also unsuccessful student union organizing campaigns in the mid-1970s at Michigan State University⁶⁶ and Ohio University.⁶⁷

Resident advisors, and later tutors, have been represented at the University of Massachusetts-Amherst since 2002 and the NLRB certified an independent USE union to represent student dining workers at Grinnell College in 2016. In addition, prior to January 1, 2024, there were represented undergraduate student employees in certain private sector GSE units and other combined units at CUNY and the University of California.⁶⁸

In 2015, the NLRB declined to assert jurisdiction over a representation petition filed on behalf of collegiate scholarship athletes at Northwestern University.⁶⁹ Six years later, NLRB General Counsel Jennifer Abruzzo issued a memorandum stating that collegiate athletes who receive compensation are employees protected under the NLRA.⁷⁰

A. USE Representation by State

As of January 1, 2024, there were six exclusively USE bargaining units in New York, four in Massachusetts, and no other state with more than two. Table 11 displays the number of student workers in exclusively USE collective bargaining units and the states where the units are located.

B. USE Representation by National Affiliation

OPEIU has organized the largest number of USE units, while the UAW organized the most employees in exclusively USE units. A breakdown by national affiliate of represented USE units and the number of employees in those units is provided in Table 12. One major development concerning USE representation has been the certification of several unaffiliated independent student employee-led unions at Grinnell College, Columbia University, Dartmouth College, and Bennington College.⁷¹ Significantly, the total number of undergraduate workers represented by those four independent unaffiliated unions constitutes over 30% of the total number of workers in exclusively USE bargaining units as of January 1, 2024.

Closing Remarks

The 2024 Directory demonstrates that collective bargaining in higher education continues to grow in the United States. The growth constitutes a major exception to the general decline in unionization seen in other United States industries over the decades.

We have found that the overall rate of faculty union representation is 27%, with the number of represented faculty increasing by 7.5% since the 2012 Directory. However, the rate of GSE union representation is even higher at 38% and the number of represented GSEs has increased by 133% in little more than a decade. Similarly, there has been significant increases in the number of separate bargaining units of exclusively postdoctoral scholars, academic researchers, and undergraduate student employees.

The factors underlying this growth in union representation across these groups include the restructuring of the faculty, with most positions today being NTT, the expansion in the number of postdoctoral positions, the high level of support for labor, particularly among those under 30, the post-pandemic labor resurgence, labor law changes including the *Columbia University* decision, and a greater acceptance of workplace democracy on campus.

The data and comprehensive collection of contracts presented in the 2024 Directory is a unique resource for negotiators, administrators, unions, academics, and vendors, providing a snapshot of union representation and collective bargaining involving academic labor and non-academic undergraduate workers. With necessary financial support and cooperation from institutions, unions, law firms, and all others who utilize this resource, we hope to make our data available through an interactive website and to publish future directories with updated data and hyperlinks to more recent contracts.

Following publication of the 2024 Directory, the National Center will begin new quantitative and qualitative research initiatives analyzing the causes and consequences of unionization and collective bargaining on campus in the 21st century.
